- 1. This is a civil penalty proceeding pursuant to Section 16(a) of the Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA), 15 U.S.C. § 2615(a), and pursuant to the Consolidated Rules of Practice Governing Administrative Assessment of Civil Penalties and the Revocation/Termination or Suspension of Permits (Consolidated Rules), 40 C.F.R. Part 22. The authority to take action under Section 16(a) of TSCA, 15 U.S.C. § 2615(a) is vested in the Administrator of the United States Environmental Protection Agency, (EPA). The Administrator of the EPA has delegated this authority under TSCA to the Regional Administrator of the EPA Region 4 by the EPA Delegation 12-2-A, dated May 11, 1994. The Regional Administrator of the EPA Region 4 has re-delegated this authority under TSCA to the Director of the Air, Pesticides, and Toxics Management Division, by the EPA Region 4 Delegation 12-2-A, dated January 14, 2009. In accordance with 40 C.F.R. § 22.3(a), the Complainant in this matter is the Director of the Air, Pesticides, and Toxics Management Division. The Respondent is Camaj Interiors & Exteriors.
- 2. Complainant and Respondent have conferred for the purpose of settlement pursuant to 40 C.F.R. § 22.18 and desire to quickly resolve this matter and settle the allegations described herein without a formal hearing. Therefore, without the taking of any evidence or testimony, the making of any argument, or the adjudication of any issue in this matter, and in accordance with 40 C.F.R. § 22.13(b), this Expedited CAFO will simultaneously commence and conclude this matter.
- 3. Under Sections 402 and 406 of TSCA and 40 C.F.R. § 745.89, any firm performing or offering to perform any regulated renovation, repair or painting activities for compensation at any target housing (as that term is defined in TSCA Section 401(17) and 40 C.F.R. § 761.103), or at child occupied facilities must obtain an EPA Lead Renovation Firm Certification prior to performing such activities.
- 4. Based on documentation Respondent provided to the EPA on or about June 24, 2011, the EPA alleges that the Respondent performed renovation, repair and painting activities on or about September 30, 2010, at 1052 Cherry Street, Jacksonville, Florida 32205 without having obtained the required Firm Certification. Therefore, Respondent failed to comply with Sections 402 and 406 of TSCA and 40 C.F.R. 745.81 and 745.89.
- 5. The EPA is authorized to enter into this Expedited CAFO pursuant to Section 16 of TSCA and 40 C.F.R. §§ 22.13(b) and 22.18.
- 6. In signing this Expedited CAFO, Respondent: (1) admits that the Respondent is subject to the requirements of 40 C.F.R. Part 745, Subpart E; (2) admits the jurisdictional allegations set forth

- above; (3) neither admits nor denies the allegation of violation contained herein; (4) consents to the assessment of the penalty assessed herein; and (5) waives any right to a hearing to contest the allegations contained herein.
- 7. By its signature below Respondent certifies, subject to civil and criminal penalties for making a false submission to the United States Government, that the alleged violation has been corrected.
- 8. The EPA has assessed and Respondent agrees to pay a civil penalty of **Two Hundred Dollars** (\$200) to settle this matter within five (5) days of receipt of this letter. The civil penalty of **Two Hundred Dollars** (\$200) is to be paid in accordance with the following instructions:
 - A. Respondent shall remit the penalty payment by either a cashier's or certified check made payable to the "Treasurer, United States of America".
 - B. The Respondent shall note on the face of the check the Respondent's Name, the TSCA Number, TSCA-04-2012-2662(b), and Case Number, 11-113.
 - C. The penalty payment shall be submitted by one of the methods below.

- 10. The EPA reserves all of its rights to take enforcement action for any other past, present, or future violations by Respondent of 40 C.F.R. Part 745, Subpart E not specifically addressed in this ESA or any other federal statute or regulation.
- 11. Each party shall bear its own costs and fees, if any.
- 12. Each undersigned representative of the parties to this Expedited CAFO certifies that he or she is fully authorized by the party represented to enter into this Expedited CAFO and hereby legally binds that party to it.
